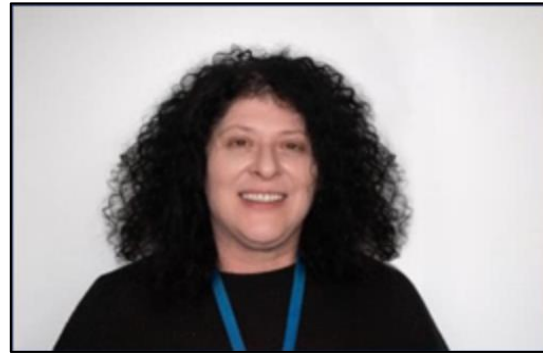

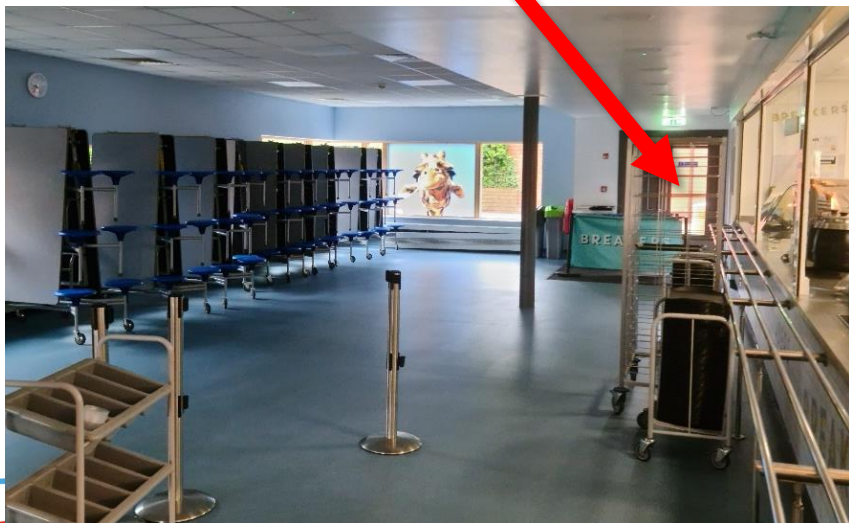

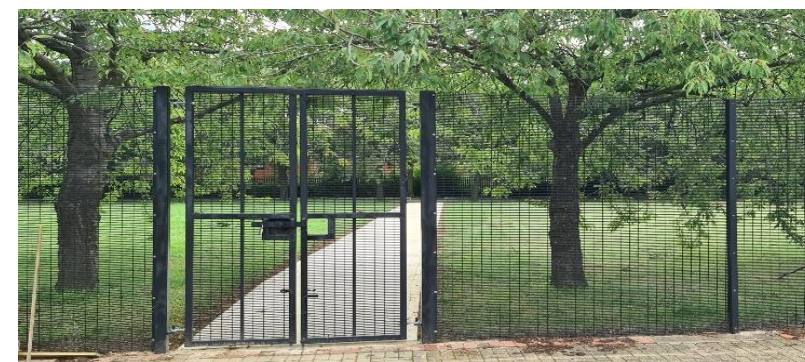

Mobile Phone Guidance

- Mobile phones and headphones/earbuds are not allowed to be seen or used inside the school premises at any time of the day.
- We recognise that for safety and wellbeing reasons both students and their families will wish for them to carry a mobile phone to school. Therefore mobile phones must be switched off upon arrival and placed into bags or secure coat pockets until they leave school at the end of the day.
- Parents/carers wishing to contact their child throughout the day must do this via school reception and not directly to a child's mobile phone.
- Post 16 students must also adhere to this policy however, with one exception: Post 16 students may use mobile phones for academic and research purposes within the Common Room and Study Room.

Mobile Phone Consequences

- If students breach these rules, staff will **confiscate the mobile phone**, place it into a sealed envelope with clear identification of who the phone belongs to and store it in a lockable unit within reception. **Students receive an after school detention for each confiscation.**
- **1st Confiscation:** Students can collect their mobile phone at the end of their detention where staff will sign phones back to students.
- **2nd Confiscation:** Students can collect their mobile phone at the end of their detention in the same way as a first confiscation however parents will be contacted by Year teams to alert you of this breach of school policy.
- **3rd Confiscation onwards:** If a student reaches a third confiscation, mobile phones will only be released back to a parent/carer between 3.15-4.00pm at whichever day suits the schedule of the parent. Parents/carers will be asked to come into school to address this.
- If a student refuses to comply with the confiscation, they will be placed into our Internal Exclusion Unit until they comply. **Persistent refusal to comply with this policy will be sanctioned in accordance with the behaviour policy and Fixed Term Exclusions may be considered.**

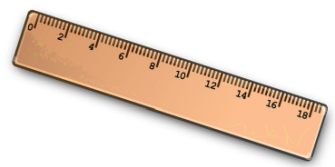

Uniform Guide

Tie* - House Colour

Tie must be full length and suitably knotted to the collar of the shirt. Compulsory for all students.



Shirt - White

Plain style, short or long sleeved, buttoned to the collar with enough material allowance to stay tucked into the waistband and the collar must hold a tie.

Blazer* - Black with KSCS Logo

Compulsory for all new students in Years 7, 8, 9 and 10. Must be worn during the school day unless given permission to remove by a member of staff or during social times.

Optional for all other students.

Trousers* - Black

Plain black trousers.

Belts should be black and large buckles are not permitted.

Jewellery

One pair of plain, round, metal stud earrings allowed (to be worn one in each ear or a single earring).

We do not accept any other forms of body piercing- clear retainers are allowed. One ring per hand (must be removed for any practical based lessons)

Optional wrist watch.



Shoes - Black

Traditional /formal style in leather or leather-type.

Heels must not exceed 5cm.

No canvas/trainer style shoes will be accepted.

Further guidance on boots will be published in the autumn term.

Tights/Socks should be black or white, plain, no patterns and not leggings.

Skirt* - Black

Knee length traditional style skirt.

Skirts must be black and of an appropriate length; 5cm or less above the knee. Skirts must not be revealing or considered indecent. The school has the final say on the decency of individual skirts. Skirts should be a traditional style, in the main polyester or cotton (no leather/denim/extreme slits allowed).The school reserves the right to have the final say.

Hair

No extreme/un-natural hair colours or styles are allowed, including tram lines or very short cuts (anything less than a number 2 cut).

Make-up

Make-up must be discrete for Years 9-13

No make-up for Years 7 and 8.

Discrete nail varnish and short extensions are permitted.

Long nail extensions are not permitted for health and safety reasons.

Jumper/Cardigan* - Black

Optional plain black v-neck jumper/ cardigan (school logo is permitted but not required)

Hooded tops are not acceptable

Coat

A waterproof coat (discrete logos acceptable).

No hoodies/ track-suit tops/ football/ sports tops/ leather or denim.

Mobile Phones

Mobile phones should be switched off during the school day and both phones and headphones kept out of sight.

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Dance/PE Kit



Training Top* - Black with Logo

Plain black long sleeved training top with school logo.
Compulsory for all students from September 2020.

T-Shirt* - Black with Logo

Plain black t-shirt with school logo.
Compulsory for all students from September 2020.

Shorts - Black

Black shorts/black tracksuit bottoms/black sports leggings are permitted for both PE and Dance lessons.

Trainers

Sports trainers should be worn for all indoor lessons.
Football boots will be required for outdoor lessons- students will be advised of their need for these by PE Staff. For health and safety reasons participation in field based sports will not be permitted without the correct footwear.
No trainers or socks should be worn for Dance lessons.

Socks - Black

Students will require a change of socks for all PE lessons.
Students should not be wearing their everyday school socks/tights for PE lessons for hygiene reasons.
Socks/tights should not be worn for Dance lessons.
